Holy Week and Bucket Lists

This year Holy Week is March 24 – March 30. it is easy for us to focus on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We sometimes do not grasp how much of Jesus' teachings etc. occurred during this week. Here is a partial list of what Jesus did that week.

Sunday – Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-40, John 12:12-19)

Monday – Jesus clears the temple for a second time. Matthew 21:12-17, Mark 11:15-19, Luke 19:45-48) The first time happened in John 2:13-17

Tuesday – Jesus' answers questions about marriage in heaven, paying taxes, and the greatest commandment. (Matthew 21:23-27, Mark 11:27-33, Luke 20:1-8) Jesus teaches in the temple courtyard. Matthew 21:23-27, Mark 12:1-40, Luke 20:9-47)

Wednesday - The gospels do not say what Jesus did. He may have spent the day in Bethany with his disciples.

Thursday – Jesus shares the Last Supper with his disciples. (Matthew 26:20-30, Mark 15:17-26, Luke 22:14-30, John 13:21-30) Jesus washes the disciple's feet and gives them a new commandment. (John 13:1-20) Jesus is betrayed and arrested. (Matthew 26:47-56, Mark 14:43-52, Luke 22:47-53, John 18:2-12)

Friday – Jesus is put on trail by both Jewish and Roman authorities. (Matthew 26:57-27:2, Mark 14:53-15:20, Luke 22:54-23:25, John 18:13-19:16) Jesus is crucified. (Matthew 27:31-56, Mark 15:20-41, Luke 23:26-49, John 19:17-37) Jesus' body is placed in the tomb. (Matthew 27:57-61, Mark 15:42-47, Luke 23:50-56, John 19:38-42) I cannot help but contrast this with people's bucket lists; that list of things they want to accomplish before their time here is ended. The things on most people's lists are centered around where they will do and what things will make them happy. Looking at what Jesus did his last week here, I would say that his bucket list was all about God and telling others about God.

We are unlike Jesus in that we do not know how much longer we will be here. But we can be like Jesus and make our life about Jesus and telling others about Jesus on our bucket lists.
